Test Retake Policy

Students will be allowed to retake a chapter test under the following guidelines:

- A student who earns a test score that is <u>less than 70%</u> will have the opportunity to retake the test.
- A student can earn a retake score of no higher than 70%
- All of the student's homework for the chapter must be turned in before being eligible to retake the test.
- The student must show Mrs. Reynolds what extra work they did to prepare for the retest.
- Student must retake the test within one week of the tests being returned. Retake deadline will be given when tests are returned.

Expectations for accelerated students:

8th grade students in this course are ahead of grade level, to maintain a slot in this course you should meet an average of 83% (B) for each quarter and receive an average of 90% on homework each quarter. There should be no behavior issues.

Test and Quizzes: 70% of the grade

- Quizzes and tests will be taken at the middle and/or end of each chapter.
- If students are absent on a test day, they will be expected to take the test the day they return.

Daily Assignments: 30% of the grade

- This grade will consist of the following:
 - <u>Daily Homework</u>: Scores which will usually be graded out of 4 points.
 - 4 points: Homework is complete with work shown (score is 85%-100%)
 - 3 points: Homework is missing a few problems or some work is not shown (score is 70%-85%)
 - 2 points: Homework is partially complete and/or some work is not shown (score is 55%-70%)
 - 0 points: Homework is less than half done and/or work is not shown (score is 0%-55%)

Corrections may be made on homework on time to improve scores if done within 2 days.

- <u>Absent Work:</u> Absent work will receive full credit when turned in within two school days for each day absent.
- Late Work: Students will receive one late homework coupon each quarter that can be attached to a late assignment to receive full credit. All late work turned in without the late homework coupon can receive up to 2 points if the work is turned in by the school deadline at the middle of the quarter and the end of the quarter.
